WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT ENROLLMENT?

Dual credit is an educational program designed to enable high school students to enroll in college courses and receive both college and high school credits for the same course. Dual Credit Enrollment is a great way for high school students to get a jump start on their college education.

WHAT IS EARLY ADMISSIONS?

Early Admission is for students desiring to take college courses. Early Admission enrollment only earns college credit.

DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENT CHECKLIST

- Contact** a high school counselor about eligibility criteria. Home schooled students should call the Pre-College Programs & Recruitment Office at (361) 485-6823 to speak with a recruitment representative.
- Apply** to Victoria College at www.ApplyTexas.org and allow 3-5 days for processing. Write down the application ID, username and password for tracking purposes.
 - For student profile, use of personal email account recommended
 - Select 2 yr college application
- Complete** testing requirements, if needed and submit scores to the Admissions & Records Office. Required scores are listed on page 4 of the Guide to Dual Credit & Early Admission.
- Attend** a required dual enrollment informational session along with one parent or guardian
- Complete** and submit the Dual Credit Agreement Form which can be accessed on page 6 and by visiting www.VictoriaCollege.edu/DualCreditEarlyAdmission.
- Complete** and submit the Dual Credit Agreement Contract
- Apply** for scholarships.
- Complete** the FAFSA at www.fafsa.ed.gov
- Pay** all tuition and fees or enroll in the payment plan by Thursday, August 13, 2020 to avoid being dropped.
- Contact** your “Career and College Coach”



Pirate Portal Username & Password

Start from the VC homepage and click the Pirate Portal link located in the blue header at the top of the page.

1. On the login page of the Pirate Portal, click the “New users click here to setup account” link.
2. Now click the “Start” in the New User Box.
3. You will be required to accept the regulations, enter your ID (SS# or V#) and birth date.
4. Next you will setup your security question and answer.
5. Finally you will need to set your options for notifications.

Once you complete these steps, it will generate your Pirate Portal username, password, and student email account. If you would like to change your password, please return to the login page of the Pirate Portal, click “Retrieve or reset your username and password” and follow the steps.

1. Go to www.VictoriaCollege.edu
2. Hover over “Getting Started” in the green ribbon at the top of the page.
3. Select “TSI Assessment.”
4. Expand “Registration and Payment Information” by clicking the green plus sign.
5. Follow the red hyperlink to view the mandatory PreAssessment Activity.
6. For first-time AppointmentPlus users, create an account. The username and password you create will be used for future appointments. Please do not create more than one profile.
7. Select Exam from the drop down box.
8. Select a date from the list.
9. Enter billing then credit card information.
10. Click continue to process your appointment.

The TSI Assessment is the test that you will take if you are NonExempt in reading, writing, and/or mathematics. The results of this test will determine:

- The areas of academic deficiencies that need to be addressed in academic foundations classes.
- Your placement in the specific developmental education classes that will best meet your instructional needs.

Dual Credit & Early Admission Agreement

- I understand that the student must complete an Apply Texas application and meet with their high school counselor to determine dual credit award prior to the registration process.
- I understand I will be enrolling in a college credit course(s) at Victoria College and will be receiving a letter grade that will be recorded on my permanent college transcript. A numerical grade may appear on the high school transcript for dual credit courses; conversion and weight of grades is the responsibility of the respective high school.
- I understand that as a minor, I may come into contact with adult content, controversial issues and opinions, and differing belief practices.
- I understand that Victoria College has no discretion to determine if any course(s) that I take will count as dual credit on my high school transcripts.
- I also understand that it is my responsibility to know what my tuition and fees total for the semester in which I am enrolled and pay by the deadlines set by Victoria College. It is my responsibility to be able to locate these payment deadlines. If I belong to a school district that pays for my tuition, fees, and/or books, that it is that school district's discretion as to the terms and conditions of what they will or will not award funds for, and in return it is my responsibility to make sure that those funds are applied to my account.
- If I elect to pay by a payment plan, I understand that the payment plan fee of \$20.00 is non-refundable. I understand that my initial payment method must remain the same for the second and third payment as per the payment plan agreement made with the Payments Office.
- I understand that if I wish to withdraw from or drop any of my college course(s) it is my responsibility to first discuss this matter with my parent(s) and high school counselor. In order to officially drop a course I may do so through my Pirate Portal. I also understand that I may or may not receive a refund based on the timeframe I decide to withdraw from my college course(s). It is my responsibility to be able to locate these refund periods.
- I understand that by enrolling at Victoria College, I am responsible for knowing, understanding, and following all policies, rules, and regulations at Victoria College in addition to following the rules and regulations set forth by the high school.
- I understand that all core curriculum courses are required by law to transfer to any public institution in the state of Texas; and it is my responsibility to ensure that any coursework attempted at Victoria College is following an appropriate degree plan of the institution that a degree is sought after.
- I understand that I and one parent/guardian are expected to attend Dual Enrollment Information Session prior to the first semester of enrollment.
- I understand my high school counselor(s) and principal(s) have legal, academic privilege to my Victoria College records.
- I understand that I may place out of a course using AP, CLEP, SAT, and/ or ACT scores so long as I have met the specified testing standard for that particular course. To have a credit by exam recognized, I understand that I must complete a credit by exam form and submit a copy of my scores to the VC Admissions & Records Office.

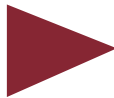

PAYMENT PLANS

Victoria College offers payment plans to help you secure your classes.

A \$20 nonrefundable fee is required to enroll in a payment plan. The payment schedule varies per semester, so be sure to review the payment deadlines and amounts before you enroll in a payment plan. A \$25 late fee will be charged for each payment that is not received by the due date. You may enroll in a payment plan online or in person.

DROPPING A COURSE

Students who wish to drop a VC course must speak with their counselor and receive permission. If it is felt that dropping a course is in the best interest of the student, they may do so by logging into their Pirate Portal. Once the drop has been processed the counselor will receive confirmation from Victoria College. Home schooled students who wish to drop a course must contact the Pre-College Programs & Recruitment office directly. The reason for the drop must be indicated on all drop requests.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Will my dual credit classes transfer to other institutions?

Course completed at Victoria College are easily transferable to any public institution in the state of Texas. As far as course applicability, that may be dependent on the institution and the degree plan that the student wishes to pursue.

2. Are my books and materials included in tuition and fees?

No, but some classes may have eBooks attached to them. If there are no eBooks the students will need to purchase the books separately. Textbooks can be purchased at the VC Bookstore, and eBooks can be accessed through the canvas shell.

3. Do I need a parking permit when parking on the Victoria College campus?

No, students are not required to have a parking permit. Students are free to park in any spot unless marked visitor or reserved.

4. Can dual credit students apply for financial aid?

While dual credit students cannot qualify for federal funding they may qualify for TPEG by completing their FAFSA. In addition, there are scholarship opportunities available.

5. Can I place out of a course using AP, CLEP, SAT, and/ or ACT scores?

Yes, as long as the student meets the specified testing standard for that particular course. Need to get a credit recognized? Submit a Credit by Exam Form, with a copy of your scores, to the VC Admissions & Records Office.

6. Will I be required to take any exams on the VC campus if I am in an online class?

Some instructors may require students to take their exams and/or final exam at the Victoria College Testing Center. If so, that will be specified in the instructor's syllabus.

7. Are dual credit courses pass or fail, and do they go on my high school transcript?

Grades received when taking a college course for dual credit are reported in two ways. Student receives a letter grade on their college transcript and a numeric grade is reported to the high schools for midterms and final grades.

8. Are accommodations available for dual credit students?

Victoria College offers equal access to educational opportunities for all individuals. Disability support services are provided to qualified students with documented disabilities. 10. Is my dual credit class all year long?

Traditional college courses are 16-weeks long during fall or spring semesters. 4 and 8 week courses are also available based on high school allowances.

VISD/VC DUAL CREDIT STUDENT CONTRACT

The VISD Education Foundation and Victoria College Foundation created a Dual Credit Partnership to offer Victoria East and West students tuition at a reduced rate. This opportunity allows students to receive college credit while in high school and begin their college career with additional support.

TO QUALIFY YOU MUST:

- Attend a Dual Credit Informational Session with a parent or guardian
- Be TSI-Complete
- Have applied to Victoria College
- Have confirmed your course(s) (subject and mode of instruction) with your Career and College Coach prior to the specified semester confirmation deadline.

The \$214.00 tuition credit, which will considerably reduce the course cost, may only be applied to one dual credit course per semester within the academic year (fall/spring). Course registration will be approved by the Career and College Coach and high school counselor prior to enrollment.

DROPPING A COURSE

This financial assistance is similar to financial aid offered in college. For that reason, a VISD student will not be eligible for funding during the second semester, if he/she drops the first semester course for which the tuition credit has been applied.

CONTRACT POINTS TO CONSIDER

A. The \$214.00 tuition credit may only be applied to an approved dual credit course. All other courses will be offered at the regular tuition rate.

- a. Continuation of funds require a student to earn a cumulative college GPA of a 2.0 or higher.
- b. If a student is placed on Academic Probation and/or Enforced Withdrawal by Victoria College, the student will not be awarded a \$214.00 credit for the following semester.

B. A student may appeal to the Career and College Coach if:

- a. There was death in the family
- b. An injury or illness occurred
- c. Other extenuating circumstances

The Victoria College and Victoria ISD review committee will evaluate the appeal to determine funding for the proceeding semester.
