Introduction	<p>Thesis Statement</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subjective (Feelings) or Objective (Facts) Description • Clear Specific Topic • Provide the reader with enough details to picture or imagine the topic
Point One	<p>Support of Thesis</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sensory description or context (taste, touch, smell, sight, sound) • Abstract description or context (emotions and ideas) • Specific description ->general description • General description -> specific description
Point Two	<p>Support of Thesis</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to convey dominate the impression
Point Three	<p>Support of Thesis</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Finish with the specific or general description, opposite of what was started with
Conclusion	<p>Restatement of the thesis (in different words) or review of key points</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Leave the reader with a strong image or impression of the topic • How the subject relates to anyone • Reader call to action
