End-of-Year Summary Report 2015-2016





Executive Summary

The 2015-2016 academic year began with a new Victoria College President, Dr. David Hinds, at the helm and all on deck.

That's why Victoria College and the Victoria Independent School District have come together with a solution for VISD students. On March 3 at Victoria West High School, VC President David Hinds and VISD Superintendent Robert Jaklich announced that beginning in Fall 2016, up to 200 eligible VISD students can dual enroll in one VC class per semester for just \$50.

This is thanks to a partnership between the VISD Education Foundation and the VC Foundation. With in-county tuition for a three-credit-hour class at \$264, support from the two foundations will cover \$214 in tuition for each participating student.



The Texas Economic Development Council (TEDC) recognized Victoria College's Emerging Technology Complex with its Workforce Excellence Award at the recent TEDC Mid-Year Conference in Irving.



Victoria College was one of 27 colleges and universities selected to receive Texas Workforce Commission grants through the Governor's Summer Merit Program for summer youth camps that focus on science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM).

The grants provide the opportunity for 2,007 students statewide from ages 14 to 21 to attend camps that will help prepare them for high-skill and high-demand jobs.

VC received \$51,888 that will go to 25 scholarships for its Texas Pre-freshman Engineering Program (TexPREP), which offers middle school students the opportunity to learn about STEM careers while earning high school elective credits






Unduplicated Credit Enrollment Trends




Total Fall Credit Enrollment





Ethnicity of Fall Credit Students







Gender of Fall Students






Total Unduplicated CE Enrollment

How are Points/Funding Calculated?


Since the points are based on milestones achieved, multiple points can be awarded for an individual student. Points are awarded for students who enroll in current year and:

- Successfully completed the first college level reading/writing course; .5 point reading, .5 point writing, 1 point reading/writing intensive
- Successfully completed their first 15 semester credit hours (SCH); 1 point
- Successfully completed their first 30 SCH; 1 point
- Earned a degree or certificate (not in a critical field); 2 points
- Earned a degree or certificate in a critical field; 2.25 points
- Transferred to a senior institution after having successfully completed 15 SCH; 2 points








Leo J. Welder Center for the Performing Arts Days of Utilization

Leo J. Welder Center for the Performing Arts Events per Year




