Electrocardiogram Technician

This course will cover fundamentals of cardiovascular anatomy and physiology; Including basic electrocardiography procedures, interpretation of basic dysrhythmias, and appropriate treatment modalities. Students will be able to describe the anatomy and physiology of the cardiovascular system, perform basic electrocardiography procedures, and interpret basic dysrhythmias. Once a student successfully passes the NHA certification exam they will be a Certified EKG Technician (CET).

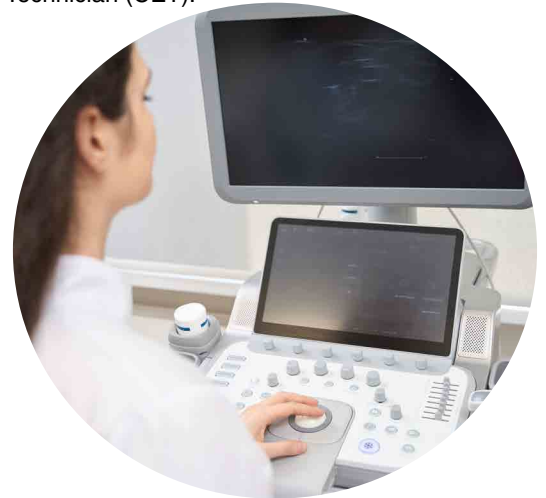

Medical Assisting

Medical assistants work alongside physicians, mainly in outpatient or ambulatory care facilities, such as medical offices and clinics. Medical assistants are cross-trained to perform administrative and clinical duties. Duties vary from office to office depending on location, size, specialty, and state law.

Once a student successfully passes the certification exam, they will be a Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA).

A day in the life of a medical assistant might include:

- Taking medical histories
- Explaining treatment procedures to patients
- Collecting and preparing laboratory specimens
- Assisting the physician during exams
- Preparing and administering medications
- Using computer applications
- Updating and filing patient medical records
- Verifying patient health insurance benefits and coverage
- Scheduling appointments

Medication Aide for Nurse Aide

A medication aide is a certified nursing assistant (CNA) that has completed additional classroom training to be certified to dispense medications to patients while working under the supervision of a registered nurse.

A medication aide is permitted by the Texas Health and Human Services administer medications to residents in:

- Nursing facilities,
- Intermediate care facilities for individuals with an intellectual disability or related conditions
- Correctional institutions
- Assisted living (personal care) facilities

Medication Aide Update

Intensive training in an identified area(s) to meet continuing education and/or review/update requirements associated with professional licensure or certification. Medication Aides MUST renew their permit annually. This includes taking this 7 hour WCE course and paying the \$15 fee to the Department of Aging and Disability Services (DADS). First year permit holders may renew by paying the DADS fee only. Permits that have lapsed for one year or more CANNOT be renewed. The 7 hour continuing education class should be taken at least three months before your permit expires. A medication aide is also a nurse aide and must receive nurse aide continuing in-service documentation. Course is strictly online. This course is no longer offered face-to-face.

Nurse Aide

A 50-hour 60-hour Texas Department of Health and Human Services-approved Nurse Aide clinical only component designed to prepare the learner to function safely and effectively as a care provider in Long-Term Care facilities, the home, and other care settings. The nursing skills laboratory portion of the course will be conducted on the Victoria College campus. The clinical portion of the course is conducted in area healthcare agencies. The program is offered in off-campus sites as well. Successful completion entitles the learner to a certificate of completion and the opportunity to take the Texas Nurse Aide Skills and Written Exams for placement on the Texas Nurse Aide Registry as Certified Nurse Aide (C.N.A.).

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Pharmacy Technician

Pharmacy technicians review dosage calculations, drug classifications, dispensing of prescriptions, billing and reimbursement in a retail or other pharmacy setting. They work in pharmacies, including those found in grocery and drug stores, and in hospitals.

Course content includes: pharmacy medical terminology; the pharmacy practice in multiple environments; pharmacy calculations and measurements; reading and interpreting prescriptions; and defining drugs by generic and brand names. Through classroom lecture and hands-on labs, students will review dosage calculations, drug classifications, the "top 200 drugs," I.V. flow rates, sterile compounding, dose conversions, aseptic technique, the handling of sterile products, total parenteral nutrition (TPN), dispensing of prescriptions, inventory control, and billing and reimbursement.

Phlebotomy

Victoria College offers a Phlebotomy course designed to develop skills in performance of a variety of blood collection methods using proper techniques and universal precautions. The classroom and laboratory portions of the course are conducted on the Victoria College campus. The clinical portion of the course is conducted in area healthcare agencies, clinics, private physicians' offices, and medical laboratory facilities.

A day in the life of a phlebotomist might also include:

- Collect blood samples from patients
- Practice proper patient identification
- Decipher the best method for drawing blood depending on the patient
- Expect to work with a patients varying in age and health status
- Be friendly, courteous and sympathetic when working with patients
- Keep your phlebotomy cart or station well-organized at all times
- Practice infection control standards at all times

Veterinary Assistant

Veterinary assistants assist the veterinarian during examinations. Students will learn about the care of animals as well as how to recognize signs of illness and disease as well as skills necessary to maintain an efficient front office.

Survey of veterinary medicine, including veterinary-related careers, safety in the veterinary workplace, the human-companion animal bond, animal restraint, client relations, and basic medical terminology. Clinical will cover survey of basic veterinary and nursing care skills. Includes aseptic techniques and operating room procedures, and the roles and responsibilities of the veterinary team in a clinical setting. Clinicals will be held at a local area animal hospital.
