THE 1892 VICTORIA COUNTY COURTHOUSE--HISTORY ILLUMINATED

Thursday, Sept. 29 • 5:30 p.m.

Jeff Wright, Victoria County Heritage Director and Executive Director of Victoria Preservation, Inc., takes us on a photographic tour of the historic Victoria County Courthouse. Built in 1892 by nationally-renowned Texas architect J. Riely Gordon, this Romanesque structure is made of Texas granite and Indiana limestone. Restored in 2001, it has been named as one of the most impressive historic courthouses in Texas and is still a functioning courthouse to this day.

TEXAS ARCHAEOLOGY MINI-SYMPOSIUM Saturday, Oct. 15 • 2-5 p.m.

Saturday, Oct. 15 • 2-5 p.m. Speakers begin on the hour.

Three prominent archaeologists join us for discussions about archaeology in Texas, and in particular the Coastal Bend. Dr. Alan Slade starts the discussions with information about his studies of Clovis lithic technology; Sergio Ayala speaks about utilizing experimental archaeology; and the discussion concludes with Dr. Tom Hester who shares his expertise in prehistoric technology and lithics.



An independent consultant, researcher, and writer working on projects dealing with the history of the trans-Mississippi American West and North American Indian art and culture, Bruce Shackelford is the Texas History Curator at the Witte Museum. He is also well-known as an appraiser for 13 seasons on the Antiques Roadshow show on National Public Television. Bruce speaks about the cattle industry from a "big picture" point of view--from the first recorded cattle drives under Spain to the cattle boom in post 1868.

Do you have ranching artifacts and cattle industry items? Take part in MCB's ranching artifact roundup! For the roundup, Bruce Shackelford will be joined by Katherine Nelson Hall, Texas Heritage Curator at the Witte Museum and set photographer for PBS Antiques Roadshow. Bruce and Katherine will provide information to owners about the artifact's use in the cattle industry. Information about artifacts will be included in the museum's research database in anticipation of the opening of expanded galleries and the exhibit, Where Texas Ranching Began, in October 2023.
