Listed are common frequently asked questions.

After registering, when do I have to pay?

Students must make payment arrangements by noon on the registration/payment deadline listed in the CTE-CE schedule to remain enrolled. If students do not coordinate full payment by the deadline, they will be dropped from the class. Registration is not complete until your classes have been paid in full or you have initiated a payment plan. Financial aid and scholarships do not cover 100% of tuition. If you have received a financial aid or scholarship award notification, it will not be applied to your account until you have contacted our office AND paid any remaining balance.

What is your cancellation policy?

Victoria College reserves the right to cancel classes and change class times or instructors as needed without notice.

In the event of inclement weather, class may be cancelled.

Students will be notified of cancellations via the phone number listed on their Pirate Portal account and/ or their VC email address.

What is the Refund Policy?

No refunds will be given after the course start date.

A 100% refund is given if a withdrawal request is received before the class begins, or if the class is cancelled by the College. No refund is issued after the class begins. Law Enforcement Academy students will receive an 80% refund if the withdrawal is completed during the first five calendar days following the first class meeting.

Direct deposit refunds are made to students who have designated a checking or savings account through their student portal. If no direct deposit profile has been established, a check is mailed to the student's mailing address of record on file with the registrar.


What special accommodations are available?

Fiber Optics Technician - \$1,100 CSIR 1052



Prerequisite: Basic working knowledge of computers, the ability to see and identify small items, DataLynk and the ability to speak the English language.

This introductory fiber optics technician course, which is offered in partnership with BDI DataLynk, is designed for anyone interested in becoming a Certified Fiber Optic Technician. The course combines theory and 85% hands-on activities to prepare the student to take the CFOT (Certified Fiber Optic Technician) exam that is sanctioned by the FOA (Fiber Optics Association). Students will learn how to identify fiber types; recognize various connectors used in fiber installation; and install, terminate, spice, and properly test installed fiber cable to existing standards. Certification exams will be administered and graded during the class. Students must pass both the written and hands-on exams to successfully pass this course. All course materials, certification exam costs, and 1-year membership to the FOA are included. 20 contact hours

Fiber Optics Specialist - \$2,000 CSIR 1091



Corequisite: Registration in Fiber Optic Technician (CSIR 1052); the ability to see, manipulate, DataLyn and hold small tools and test equipment; and ability to read and speak the English language.

This comprehensive fiber optics course, which is offered in partnership with BDI DataLynk, explains the variety of testing standards, equipment, and technological approaches used in fiber network testing and splicing and how to choose among them. This course combines theory and 85% hands-on activities to prepare the student to take two certification exams, including the CFOS/T (Certified Fiber Optics Testing & Maintenance Specialist), and CFOS/S (Certified Fiber Optics Specialist in Splicing) tests that are sanctioned by the FOA (Fiber Optics Association). Students will explore the overall spectrum of testing and maintenance of singlemode fiber optics networks, see demonstrations of various pieces of equipment used in testing and maintenance, and learn fusion and mechanical splicing of either single or multimode fiber optic cables. Certification exams will be administered and graded during the class. Students must pass both the written and hands-on exams to successfully pass this course. All course materials, certification exam costs, and 1-year membership to the FOA are included. 20 contact hours







Truck Driving – Class A & Class B CDL Training (Texas Specific)

Prerequisites:

- Valid Texas Class C Driver License
- Valid Texas Commercial Learner Permit (CLP) for the appropriate class (A or B) with no outstanding unpaid citations

Overview:

This course provides comprehensive training for individuals seeking a State of Texas Commercial Driver License (CDL) in either Class A or Class B. The course includes preparation for mastery of the CDL examination, general truck driving skills with hands-on components, and instruction coordinated with the Department of Transportation.

Class A CDL Training

- (***NEW launching Night/Weekend classes in July 2025**)
 - 200 contact hours
 - Tuition: \$4,750
 - Prepares students to operate tractor-trailer combinations, with an emphasis on safe operation, vehicle inspection, and maneuvering in a variety of traffic situations and environments

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


