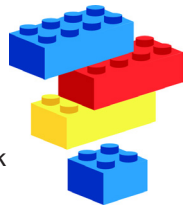


LEGO ENGINEERING presented by Fastforward Kids \$98 per camp (4 days)

MONDAY—NATURALISTS, FRIENDS OF NATURE-Learn about field naturalists, why they do what they do and the

tools they use. Assemble a virtual daypack and get tips for how to gather what you need at home. Study safety skills and respect for the animal world through game-based learning.

TUESDAY—ANIMALS! ANIMALS!-Examine animal pelts, skulls, tracks and more. Discover how animals use adaptations to survive in their habitats. Investigate several habitats and create interactive models, animal masks and journals. Play, "Oh Deer!," an animal survival game, to study how animals meet their needs.

WEDNESDAY—BEAKS, MIMICRY, AND MIGRATION-Study how some animals use disguises for safety and predation. Test how birds use their beaks for eating. Take a simulated migratory trip and test your skills against the dangers birds face on their migratory journey.

THURSDAY—FUN WITH AMPHIBIANS, AND REPTILES-Observe and compare the features of frogs, toads, turtles, lizards and snakes. Determine why they are important to our environment. Join in the Cricket Frog chorus and play a game that demonstrates how citizen naturalists help endangered frogs survive.
