Ensuring every member of our community has access to our college and equitable opportunities for success in our college. Improving lives – one student at a time – is VC's way of supporting a stronger community.

## **NSC**

National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) Total Completion Rate tracks students from an entering first-time Fall cohort at VC. The cohorts are tracked through any transfers and seeks to measure degree or certificate completion within a six year timespan. Thus, the entering Fall 2013 cohort is tracked through 2019 and only 41% completed VC in those six years.

## **THECB TRANSFER**

Transfers to universities from VC are measured by cohort year in a six year window. Thus, the entering Fall 2013 cohort is tracked through 2019 and 20.6% transferred from VC in those six years.

Ensuring Students are committed to a pathway that leads to the completion of a certificate, degree, or transferability to a 4 year institution.

Completion happens when a student completes their studies. Through reverse transfer, students who leave VC can still earn a VC credential if they complete the needed coursework at university.



#### **QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER**

- Do students know the requirements for success? Do we monitor student progress and engage those at risk?
- How does the financial aid counseling process help students think through the financing of their entire baccalaureate and not just remaining enrolled or completing the associate degree?
- To what extent does VC collaborate with key transfer partners? How often do
  presidents, chief academic officers, other senior administrators, program faculty,
  department chairs, and deans meet with their four-year counterparts?
