Point One	Support of Thesis Sensory description or context (taste, touch, smell, sight, sound) Abstract description or context (emotions and ideas) Specific description -> general description General description -> specific description
Point Two	Support of Thesis Continue to convey dominate the impression
Point Three	Support of Thesis • Finish with the specific or general description, opposite of what was started with
Conclusion	Restatement of the thesis (in different words) or review of key points • Leave the reader with a strong image or impression of the topic • How the subject relates to anyone • Reader call to action
