

# Literary Analysis Outline

How are you going to convince the reader to see what you see?

Introduction	<p>Thesis Statement</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Hook</li><li>● Write a few sentences with details to help introduce your topic.</li><li>● Often (but not always), the thesis is the last sentence of the introduction.</li></ul> <p>Sample thesis: "The short story "The Lottery" demonstrates the power of tradition and ritual in society even if that tradition or ritual is unfair or unjust."</p>
Point One	<p>Support of Thesis</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Clear topic sentence makes sure it relates to your writing task.</li><li>● Introduce your topic further.</li><li>● Use a quote or other examples.</li><li>● Identify and explain the example you just gave.</li><li>● Explain how it relates to real life (if needed)</li><li>● Transition to the next topic.</li></ul>
Point Two	<p>Support of Thesis</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Clear topic sentence makes sure it relates to your writing task.</li><li>● Introduce your topic further.</li><li>● Use a quote or other examples.</li><li>● Identify and explain the example you just gave.</li><li>● Explain how it relates to real life (if needed)</li><li>● Transition to the next topic.</li></ul>
Point Three	<p>Support of Thesis</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Clear topic sentence makes sure it relates to your writing task.</li><li>● Introduce your topic further.</li><li>● Use a quote or other examples.</li><li>● Identify and explain the example you just gave.</li><li>● Explain how it relates to real life (if needed)</li><li>● Transition to the next topic.</li></ul>
Conclusion	<p>Restatement of the thesis (in different words) or review of key points</p> <p>Sample re-worded thesis: "Today, "The Lottery" is a reminder that people need to stand up for what they believe in and not just follow unfair traditions and rituals that have been passed on for generations."</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Wrap up your ideas on the topic</li><li>● Leave your reader with a final thought or question</li></ul> <p>Sample final question: "If we as a society had never fought for women to vote, or never spoke out against discrimination, how would we be living today?"</p>
